## From the Director's Desk



If you happened to watch the news or got on social media this past month, you probably saw that the state of New York passed a law that approved for abortions to be performed up until a child is born. They call this, "The Reproductive Health Act." In celebration of this law passing, the Empire State Building was lit up pink.

If you are reading this article then more than likely you were in a state of horror and sorrow along with many other Americans upon finding this out. The fight to protect unborn lives may have seemed hopeless. However, I want to remind you of the hope I have.

When Samson had his hair cut off, his eyes gauged, and he was held as a slave to the Philistines, his life had seemed hopeless. He had made a mistake, he had backslidden, and now it looked as though the purpose for his life was over. However, in his last moments, God granted his one last request and honored Samson's repentant heart (Judges 16:28).

Joseph had a dream. That dream didn't go over too well with his brothers. In fact, after being sold into slavery by his own siblings and then sent to prison for being wrongfully accused, his story didn't seem to be falling in line with the dream that God had given him years prior. However, through a strange line of events (that could only be orchestrated by God), Joseph's dream finally became a reality (Genesis 41:41-44).

Just as David recounted his victories that God gave him before his big battle against Goliath (1 Samuel 17:34-37), we too must remember the victories God has given us. We must remember the victories that God has brought His people through when the situations seemed as though there was no victory in sight, the government leaders made laws that weren't in line with God's word (Daniel and Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego to name a couple) and all hope seemed lost.

**Baby Basics Class:** Over 114 class hours

**Abstinence:** 13 presentations to a total of 266 students

**Boutique:** Almost 10,000 items given out, including diapers, formula, clothing, baby furniture and more.

**Referrals:** We referred our clients to other agencies 129 times in 2018. This fulfills our mission to not repeat services that are already being provided in our community.

**Volunteers:** Our amazing volunteers gave over 1,337 hours of their time last year, worth over \$16,580.00! We couldn't serve our clients with excellence without your faithful service. Thank you!

We are also grateful to the crew from Foundation Church who painted all the rooms. Thanks also to the Cunningham family who tied up cleaning and painting details.


Our Executive Director and Nurse Manager are in the process of fulfilling training requirements as they lay the legal and functional groundwork.

As a peer-counselor at Abigail Pregnancy Services, I meet certain young women who inspire me and make my job especially rewarding—such is my friend and client, Jazzlyn. Jazzlyn first came to our center as an EHOVE student in the GRADS program when she was pregnant with her oldest son. I personally was introduced to her this summer in the peer-counseling room after the birth of her second son.



Jazzlyn has a spark about her. She is a courageous young woman who has been through a lot in her twenty-six years. In 2016, she lost her five month old daughter in utero to a rare disease called Edwards Syndrome. In addition, Jazzlyn is the sole supporter of her two boys, ages 8 and 6 months. Despite her situation, Jazzlyn always has maintains a cheerful attitude and a positive outlook on life.

What is most impressive about Jazzlyn, however, is her love for the Word of God. Each time we meet, she is anxious to recite a verse she's memorized or discuss a Bible study she's completed.
